'St John of Beverley – Man, Monk, Miracle worker'

In March we held 2 REaction days in Beverley Minster and St Mary's Church, Beverley. We had two great days switching between the venues and including a pilgrimage through Beverley town centre. The theme of the day was 'St John of Beverley – Man, Monk, Miracle Worker and the thread running through the days was about how elements of the monastic life are useful in our own daily lives as well as how monasteries inspired the first hospitals, schools and foodbanks. Each day included a sensory tour of the two different places of Christian worship through sight, sound and touch.

In a series of workshops, the children looked at aspects of a monk's life from their care for their environment, self-sufficiency and recycling, through the art of beautiful, illuminated manuscripts to their hospitality to travellers and offer of a place of sanctuary and how we can show compassion to those seeking sanctuary in today's world. They got to try out medieval writing and planting seeds.



When Hornsea Burton school were unable to come to Beverley due to high covid cases, we went to them and had a lovely morning, taking our workshops to the school. The students enjoyed singing in Latin, planting seeds and packing for a pilgrimage.





Big Green Hoart

In March we were invited to Sentamu Academy to deliver The Big Green Heart by creator Priscilla Smith and Anne Richards, the Chaplin at the school.

Over the month every student from years 7-10 attended a lesson in the chapel which had been turned into prayer spaces and then at the centre to deliver the BGH to every student.

The BGH invites students to reflect and deal with the unforgiveness in their hearts. It was amazing to see such a positive response from students.
